Bodelwyddan Castle and its associated Warner Hotel are easily reached from the **A55 westbound from Chester or eastbound from Bangor**. Watch out for the brown signage at the approach to **Junction 25** from either direction.

Westbound: there is a slip road that leads to a roundabout. To the *left of the roundabout* is the gateway to the Castle.

Eastbound: the slip road runs up to a roundabout. Take the *first exit*, cross the bridge over the dual carriageway and at the next roundabout take the *second exit*, which leads to the Castle gateway.

About the speaker

Katharine St. Paul is Curator of Collections at the Michael Faraday Museum, the Royal Institution.

Katharine graduated from De Montfort University in Lincoln in 1997 with a degree in Conservation and Restoration Studies. She became Collections Assistant working on the Reserve Collection of the National Museum of Science and Industry in London. She was then Collections Manager at the British Dental Association Museum before moving to the Royal Institution as Curator for Collections where she has been heavily involved with a major refurbishment programme, including a new exhibition space and conservation of the collection and architecture.

The Royal Institution's iconic collections include the earliest miners' lamps made by Humphry Davy, the first electric transformer and generator made by Michael Faraday and a model of the first enzyme to have its structure determined by Lawrence Bragg's X-ray crystallography team.

Please note: the talk will begin at 2.30 pm in the Sculpture Gallery within the Castle.
