The symposium will be held at Burlington House (<http://www.rsc.org/AboutUs/Contacts/BH.asp>) which is on the north side of Piccadilly midway between Piccadilly Circus and Green Park underground stations, opposite Fortnum and Mason. Burlington House surrounds a large courtyard which also houses The Royal Academy; after entering the gates you will find the Royal Society of Chemistry at the top right hand side of the courtyard.

Travel to the symposium.

Main line rail travel to London is straightforward can be done for a reasonable price if tickets are bought in advance. Details of services can be found on the National Rail Website (www.nationalrail.co.uk) or the Trainline website, which also sells tickets (www.thetrainline.co.uk). The Piccadilly area is easily reached from all of London's main line rail stations using the tube (www.tfl.gov.uk/tube) and bus services (www.tfl.gov.uk/buses). The nearest tube stations to Burlington house are Piccadilly Circus and Green park. Bus numbers 9, 14, 19, 22, 38 all stop near Burlington House.
