What is a Research Poster?

Poster sessions provide an informal forum to report innovative projects, introduce new services and resources, or test research ideas of interest. These sessions are an increasingly important part of research conferences. It is a visual presentation outlining a piece of research – in a form that is easily assimilated and stimulates interest and discussion. The aim is a fruitful exchange of ideas between the presenter and the people reading the poster.

A Research Poster Tells a Story

A research poster is very different from a paper or a talk, and needs different techniques in producing it. Simplicity is essential in a poster – it should tell a story. As in any research presentation, the outline includes a statement of the problem, a description of the method, a summary of the work, and then a presentation of results. But within that structure, there is much scope for creativity. Brief conclusions should leave the reader with a clear message to take away.

- Page Specifications: A4 size, One page abstract, Times New Roman 10 pt, Normal font, Single space
- Title
- Authors Name (s)
- Address of the Institute or College or Department
- Abstract Text
- Results & Discussion
- Conclusions
- Schemes or Structural Formulae
- References
- E-mail address
