THE TOPIC

Biomaterials is a field that is continuing to grow in importance as people live to older ages and want to retain the same quality of life. Replacing body parts is not an easy or trivial thing to do and engineers, surgeons and clinicians have to work together to design, manufacture and then implant the various replacement body parts that are now available.

This event is designed to give you an overview of this exciting and thriving area of materials. It will give you contexts that you can use in your teaching and careers ideas that you can pass on to your students.

The day will start with the keynote lecture, given by Professor Serena Best who has lectured on this topic to a wide range of audiences all over the world. The technical presentations, given by other experts in their field will cover a range of biomedical and dental devices and materials used in medical imaging. Over lunch you will have the chance to chat with the speakers further and there will be an open discussion session after the final presentation to ask any other questions you may have.

The day will conclude with a session in which you will look at how you can use the things you have learnt back in the classroom. Once the obligatory feedback forms have been completed the course will close at approximately 1615.
