

**RSC Dalton Division Bursaries to attend XV BMIC, Angra dos Reis-Brazil, 16<sup>th</sup> August 2010**

The Sociedade Brasileira de Química and the Royal Society of Chemistry invite you to attend the XV Brazilian Meeting on Inorganic Chemistry in Angra dos Reis, state of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, 16-19<sup>th</sup> August 2010, <http://www.proppi.uff.br/bmic/>. The organizers plan to follow the pattern of earlier meetings with speakers at all levels of seniority covering a very broad range of inorganic chemistry.

Dalton Division will allocate at least ten bursaries of up to £750 allow members to present their work at the meeting and the Organizing Committee will provide a contribution to local costs (the registration fee will be waived, and £100 provided towards accommodation). We hope to support delegates with a range of areas of expertise in inorganic chemistry and with different levels of seniority.\* We assume that most of the delegates funded by the RSC will make conventional oral presentations in the scientific programme. To apply, please supply:

- an abstract for your proposed oral presentation on the template which will be available on the conference webpage <http://www.proppi.uff.br/bmic/>,
- information (< 100 words) on any other contacts/visits you would make on this trip to South America,
- abbreviated CV [max. 1 page],
- and, for applications from graduate students and postdoctoral fellows, the names of two referees to support your application.

We will send an acknowledgement of receipt by return and then let you know the outcome of your application, which will be judged by a panel appointed by Dalton Division Council.

These directions are written in the format required for the abstract to be submitted to *XV BMIC 2008* (August 16<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>, Angra dos Reis, RJ Brazil). Abstracts should not exceed one **A5 page** (14.8 x 21cm). Page margins should be 2 cm for top margin, 2.5 cm for left, 1.5 cm for right and bottom margins. Use font type **Arial**, with single spaced lines. Title of the abstract (style: "Abstract Title", 10 points, all caps, centered) could span in maximum two rows, and is followed by one blank line. Author's names are written (style: "Authors", 9 points, centered) with initials followed by dot, family names are written in full. Authors are separated by commas and marked with superscript when necessary to distinguish authors from different affiliations. Author's affiliations (style: "Author's affiliations", 8 points, italic, centered) are written in separate rows when there are more than one and last is followed by two blank lines. Abstract text (style "abstract text", 9 points) is justified on middle; paragraphs are not indented, only separated by one blank line. Abstracts should be submitted electronically via email only in **MS Word format** (.doc). The filename should be **bmich2009-firstauthorslastname**. For example, if this document was submitted it would have the filename *bmich2009-Silva*.
