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Fig. S1. The mechanical properties of IG₂ with and without TA.

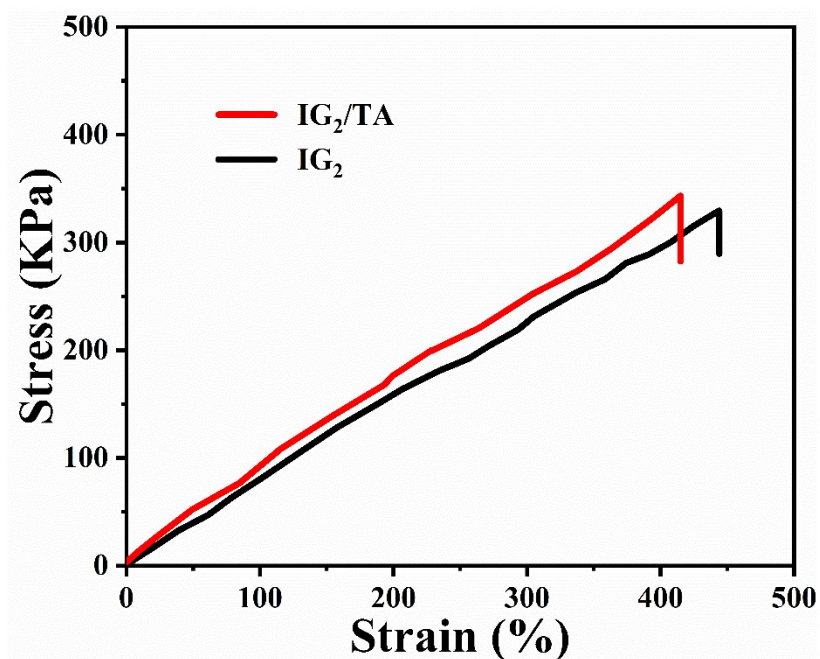


Fig. S2. Comparison of FT-IR spectra of ionogels before and after self-healing.

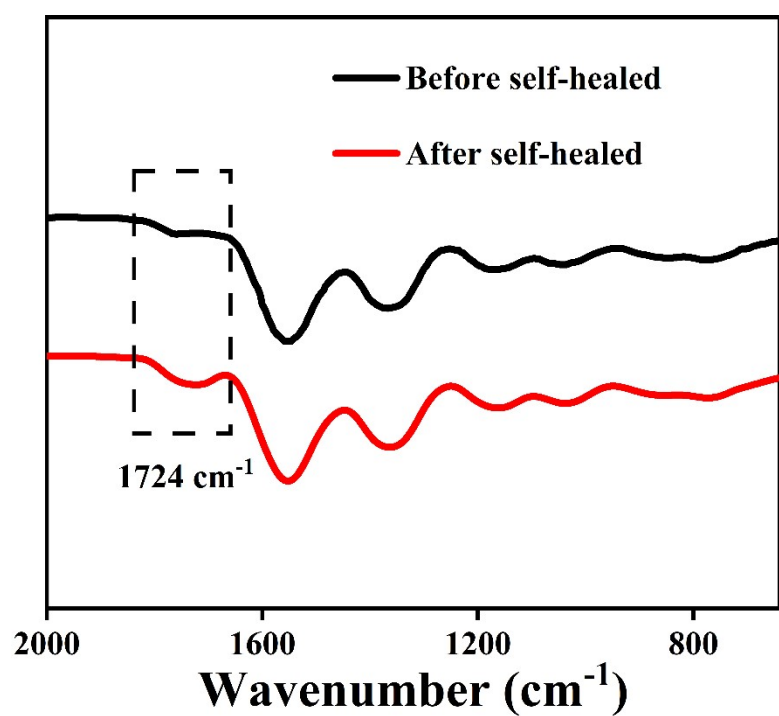


Fig. S3. Variation of mechanical properties with the time of self-healing.

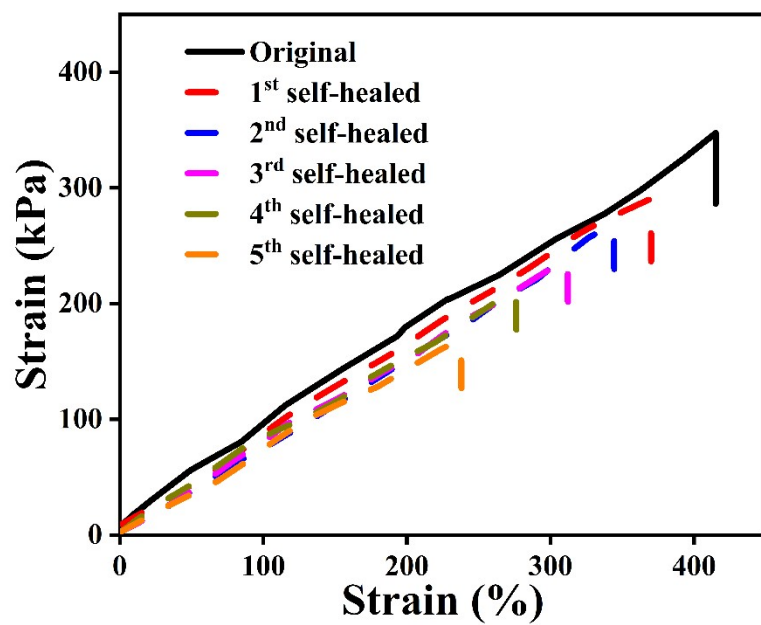


Fig. S4. The sensing performance of IG₂/TA for different storage time
